

**RESOLUTION #07-R-02 OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF  
REPUBLIC, MISSOURI, SUPPORTING THE APRIL 3, 2007 BALLOT PROPOSAL FOR A 911  
SALES TAX TO FUND THE CITY-COUNTY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Republic as follows:

**WHEREAS**, on February 3, 1997, an intergovernmental agreement between the City of Republic, Greene County and the City of Springfield, regarding the use of 911 telephone tax was approved by all governmental entities to provide for a centralized City-County emergency communications dispatch and communication operations; and

**WHEREAS**, in October, 2001, all parties amended said agreement to provide continued operation of said centers, and

**WHEREAS**, Greene County, Missouri, has determined that in order to assure continued funding of the centralized 911 service, that a sales tax shall be put to the voters in April, 2001; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Republic as follows:

1) That the Board of Aldermen hereby supports the proposal put forth by Greene County, Missouri to place a ballot measure seeking a sales tax for 911 communications service to assure continued staffing and operation of the 911 call centers providing for City-County emergency communications dispatch and communication operations.
