Republic Services will provide curbside pickup to homes within the city limits

The City has contracted with Republic Services, a private contractor, to conduct the street-by-street curbside clean-up of various household items on Saturday, April 27. Any non-acceptable items that are included will be left at the curb for disposal by the resident. Please be aware that crews cannot access citizen's personal property to assist in moving items to the curb. Clean-up will not take place at businesses, apartment buildings or vacant homes. This is a free service provided by the City of Republic, and the City reserves the right to refuse any items for clean-up that do not meet the criteria of the program or that pose a threat to the health or safety of an employee or individual participating in the collection process.
